<p>Focus text: Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy by Lynley Dodd https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/hairy-maclary/</p> <p>Enjoy sharing this classic text with your child! Join Hairy Maclary and friends as they go for a walk around the town.</p> <p>Lots of discussion, reading and writing opportunities are developed throughout the week, as the children work towards writing their own short story.</p>	<p>Read along with your child with the sound on, or mute the sound and read the story out loud to your child.</p> <p>Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy by Lynley Dodd https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/hairy-maclary/</p> <p>Encourage your child to join in with whichever approach you choose.</p> <p>Encourage your child to join in with the repetitive phrases in the story.</p> <p>Discuss with your child why do you think the dog is called Hairy Maclary?</p> <p>Ask your child to write and complete the following sentence: <i>I think he is called Hairy Maclary because...</i></p>	<p>Read the story again.</p> <p>Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy by Lynley Dodd https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/hairy-maclary/</p> <p>Encourage your child to join in with the repetitive phrases in the story.</p> <p>Look at the word used to describe the other dogs who go on the walk with him e.g. Hercules Morse. Talk about the words used to describe him, e.g. <i>big as a horse</i>.</p> <p>Ask your child to choose two or three of their favourite dogs from the book and complete the following sentences explaining why. Practise saying out loud where you've been and with whom, e.g. <i>First I went through my gate and off for a walk. Then I met</i></p>	<p>Look at the book and spot the breeds of dogs in the book.</p> <p>Consider other types of breeds of dogs that might be friends with Hairy Maclary. You may have a family dog that hasn't been mentioned but if not, have a look online at different types.</p> <p>Watch this video. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EKG89005K5A</p> <p>Parents to read the information as it may be tricky for Y1 children to read. Pause and discuss each breed focusing on new vocabulary.</p> <p>Ask - which dogs were your favourites and why?</p> <p>Choose a few. Next give them a name e.g. Patty poodle or Pete the pug. Write the names of the</p>	<p>Talk to your child about where their dogs might go, e.g. to the park, shops, woods etc.</p> <p>Read the section of the story where they meet Scarface Claw. https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/hairy-maclary/</p> <p>Talk about Hairy Maclary and his friends running home to bed.
