Ambition Lancashire is the Sustainable Community Strategy for Lancashire. It looks to our future and describes what we want the county to look like by the year 2025. As things change, so will Ambition Lancashire – to make sure that we keep focused on the key issues in Lancashire.

The Local Area Agreement (LAA) is an agreement between the Lancashire Partnership and central government, it outlines how priorities identified in Ambition Lancashire will be measured and how much improvement will be made over the 3 years from 2008 to 2011 through 58 performance indicators.
