Intermediate care review, led by the postholder, is now published and has examined the current service and made recommendations for the development of transitional service model widening out the interface between Acute and

		community services and giving a blueprint for change widely across Older Adult and Unscheduled Care services. This recommends means of tackling targets around length of stay in acute settings and intermediate care and developing pathways of care that mean care and support is delivered in the right place at the right time and that Older people have the opportunity to take long term decisions in an environment that can holistically assess their needs. • The postholder has suppoted the delivery of intergenerational work in South Ribble - the 'Respect' project - aimed at breaking down barriers between younger and Older people. This is targeting fear of crime, as identified in the Quality of Life scrutiny review in the Borough. • The postholder heads the advisory group to the local Home Improvement Agency (HIA) and has organised a Change Agent Day to raise the awareness of the HIA across the Health community.
