
Definitions

- Process procedure, method or means
- Input contribution or effort

Defining outcomes against other terms

Resources e.g. number of staff employed

Often quantitative e.g. the number of service users seen per month.
The number of operations

completed in a week

Input

Contribution of effort to achieve the output

Process

Procedure, method or means. The activities put in place and the order in which they are implemented so that the outputs can be achieved. The wa

The ways of working e.g. type of documentation or assessment to be used

Output

The amount of services produced in a given time



The measurable results, impacts or consequences of actions e.g. a reduction in the number of CYP offending or re-offending

Fewer service users report feelings of isolation and low self esteem	



Objectives and indicators

- Objectives are what we want to achieve (whether outcomes or outputs etc):
 - Prosperous economy
 - Clean environment
 - Healthier children
- Indicators are measures that quantify the achievement of our objectives:
 - The unemployment rate
 - The percentage of polluted streams
 - Immunization rate



Measuring outcomes

- Perceptions of person using the service:
 - Tools and Scales.
 - Surveys/Feedback.
- Assessment of improvements in individuals' life:
 - Feedback from care workers/support workers.
 - Document analysis.
- Population outcomes:
 - Nationally or locally collected rates.



How to choose indicators

- Does the indicator communicate the message clearly?
- Does the indicator say something of central importance about the objective?
- Do we have quality data on a timely basis?
