**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2011 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 45-53 of and Parts 111 and 1V of Schedule 9 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984,** the effect of which will be to:

**Revoke** wholly those Traffic Regulation Orders made within the Preston City Area to date by the County Council or the City Council acting as their agents pursuant to Section 101 of the **Local Government Act 1972** relating to School Entrance Markings within the Preston City Area.

**Introduce** no stopping or waiting between 08.00 and 18.00 hours on each day, Monday to Friday inclusive, in the School Entrance Markings within the Preston City Area as referred to in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order. Details of which are available at the locations and website below.

This Order will come into force on the 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2011, and any person wishing to question the validity of the Order may within 6 weeks of the date of making apply to the High Court for that purpose.
